The Stroke Association is leading a priority setting exercise. They want to find out what the most important issues are for stroke survivors and health care professionals. This will influence which research will be prioritised in the next years.

The exercise in in its last consultation phase. People can now vote for what they think future research should focus on. So far, they only heard from 11 psychologists, compared to about 60 physiotherapists. We can to do better!

Please let your voice be heard and speak up about the psychological challenges after stroke you and your stroke survivors experience. We have two weeks left to change the direction of research in the future.
