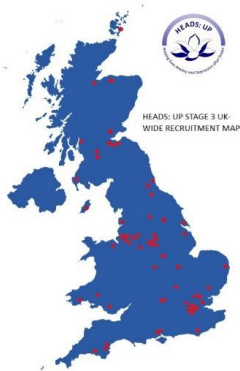

Update from HEADS: UP



HEADS: UP is a new mindfulness course to help people affected by stroke self-manage symptoms of anxiety and depression. 64 participants from across the UK took part in HEADS: UP Stage 3 online pilot RCT. Half of them attended the HEADS: UP course (treatment group) the other half did not attend the course (the control group). The first HEADS: UP online 9-week course has been completed and the remaining 2 courses will finish in April.

Key findings so far:

- Participants found the online Zoom course manageable, and the sessions are easy to follow.
- Being part of an 'online group' is enjoyable; it provides company and support
- Mindful practice at home is challenging for some.
- Some people find having a 'partner' to support them throughout the course helpful
- Some participants have seen improvement in symptoms of anxiety and depression
