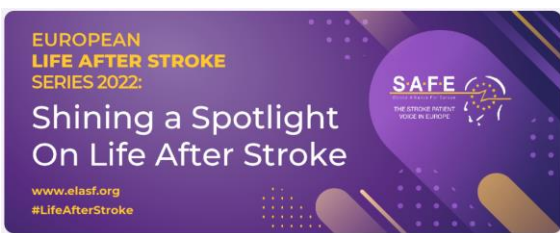
OPSYRIS will be represented at the world congress of the World Federation of NeuroRehabilitation in Vienna.
