UNDERSTANDING STROKE-SPECIFIC WORKFORCE INITIATIVES AN NHSE & SSEF NATIONWIDE CONSULTATION

- You are invited to participate in a nationwide survey about stroke-specific workforce transformation initiatives. The challenges facing the stroke workforce are well-documented, including limited staff, resources and training. However, we are aware that individuals, teams and systems are working hard to overcome these challenges through the development of non-traditional roles, new ways of working, and other innovative approaches to practice, staffing, and training. Such workforce transformation activities are vital to developing the stroke workforce of the future.
- Purpose of the survey: Through this nationwide consultation exercise, we aim to identify, explore, and describe local workforce transformation initiatives to generate practical examples for wider adoption across the stroke workforce, and to develop some key recommendations to inform future initiatives.

'DATATHON' TO EXPLORE COGNITIVE TEST DATA ORAGNISED BY DEMENTIA PLATFORMS UK


- Dementia Platform UK (DPUK) are organising a datathon with experts in cognitive testing to explore novel hypothesis around cognitive and mood testing. Several datasets have been identified and participants will be able to explore and analyse these datasets with an objective of further understanding the relationships between different tests.
- On each of the 5 days of the datathon, there will be relevant talks from experts and then delegates will be able to work in groups on the data.
- Attendees will informally present their findings at the end of the datathon and will then be allowed access to the data for a further 3 months in order to complete further analyses, with a view to publication of results where relevant. Mentoring will be available throughout and for the further 3 months. Attendees are expected to have data analytics experience and an interest in cognitive assessment tools.
- The datathon will take place on-line; delegates only require a computer with internet access.
